Dan River Middle School Parental Involvement Policy 2019-2020

- 4. Dan River Middle School will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in improving the quality of the school. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background).  - 4. Parent workshops are held throughout the year to aid parents in working with students on state content and standards.
 - 5. Other opportunities for teachers to consult with parents include Child Study Intervention Meetings, and other times scheduled at the parents' or teachers' request.
 - B. Parents have access to several websites to help their child with test taking skills (MAP Skills, etc.) The ITRT is available after school and during the day to assist parents in technology training.
 - 1. Teachers provide parents with materials and ideas at grade level workshops to aid their children in the learning process.
 - 2. Calendars are sent home each month keep parents informed events taking place at the school.
 - C. The school will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools by:

- 1. Dan River Middle School has an active volunteer program.
- 2. The visiting teacher plays an active role at Dan River Middle School involving parents in their child's education.
- D. The school will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:

The ESL teacher participates in any parent-teacher conferences, meetings, or phone calls when needed to ensure that all information is understood by ESL parents. Also, any information sent home to ESL parents related to school and parent programs is sent home in an understandable format.

Dan River Middle School, and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

1. Dan River Middle School will provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

Dan River Middle School will provide various experiences through which students may acquire a good foundation in the skills of language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, health, and technology. The faculty and staff of Dan River Middle School work diligently to ensure the success of all students in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the students to meet the State's academic achievement standards. Evidence of high quality curriculum and instruction include:

- A. PowerSchool is utilized to record student achievement; generate reports, track student performance, and share data with parents.
- B. Grade level meetings are held monthly to discuss pertinent educational information and to disaggregate data obtained from common assessments and SOL tests.
- C. Department and Focus team meetings are held monthly to discuss key curriculum and school initiatives
- D. Instructional Meetings are held weekly to train teachers in effective instructional strategies and to give the teachers an opportunity to collaborate and discuss tiered instructional interventions for students, and to disaggregate student data.
- E. Differentiation strategies are used to enhance student performance.
- F. Remediation, both in-school and after school, is provided by tutors, teachers, and paraprofessionals daily for students that are identified through data as needing more individualized remediation.
- G. Teachers are required to utilize higher level thinking strategies and Enhanced Technology Items to enhance student performance by creating weekly Reading and Math tests with at least half of the test items being higher level thinking questions and/or Enhanced Technology items.
- H. The administration and teachers encourage student motivation through recognition and rewards.
- I. MAP Skills, SOL Released Test Items, and PowerSchool Assessment and Analytics, along with a variety of other interventions are used to enhance test taking skills.

- J. Teachers participate in Staff Development throughout the year (Master Teacher, Legal Updates, Differentiated Instruction, Evaluations Procedures, Core Content, and Technology Training which includes Performance Matters, MAP, MAP Skills, various intervention programs in math and reading, Google Classroom, and Smart Board software).
- 2. Dan River Middle School will hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in middle schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

Dan River Middle School will hold two parent/teacher conferences during the 2019-20 school year. These conferences will be held on October 17, 2019 and February 20, 2020 from 3:30 PM until 6:30 PM.

3. Dan River Middle School will provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

At Open House, teachers provide parents with a description of the curriculum, academic assessments, grading procedures, and student expectations. In addition, Dan River Middle School provides parents frequent reports on their children's progress through letters sent home, parent-teacher conferences, phone calls, student progress reports and reports cards, parent workshops and meetings, emails, and information sent via PowerSchool

In addition to parent/teacher conferences, the staff is also available for consultation with parents at PTO meetings, Parent Workshops, Child Study Intervention Meetings, and other meeting times scheduled at the parents' or teachers' request.
